Character Traits

This year across the Laurus Primary Schools we are introducing six 'character traits' as part of our curricula.













These represent a range of qualities which we think mirror both our work as a UNICEF Rights Respecting School and also our three school rules: we are respectful, we do our best, we make good choices.

These character traits will be a central part of our termly Bookshelf, discussed in class and will also form the basis for the weekly achievement certificates. Some of the traits are more complex than others but the concept is that the children's understanding of each one evolves over the course of their time with us and by the time they leave us they are not only able to talk confidently about each one but regularly display behaviours which reflect them.
