Character Traits

Through our curriculum we develop **six** carefully selected character traits – bravery, citizenship, curiosity, gratitude, integrity, kindness. We believe these will support the children in school to succeed in the future of their choice.

The character traits are embedded throughout school and form a central part of each year group's termly Bookshelf and PSHE curriculum. We discuss them in weekly assemblies and they form the basis for the weekly achievement certificates the children receive.









The Character Traits represent a range of qualities which we believe mirror our three school rules:

we are respectful, we do our best, we make good choices.

The Great Debate

As part of our speaking and listening curriculum the children have enjoying taking part in bi-weekly debate sessions where they have been able to share their thoughts and opinions about various topics, including the positive and negative impact of Zoo's and whether children should contribute to completing chores at home!

The children have learnt that for a debate to succeed, they need to work together to listen and ask questions of one another. We have also encouraged and promoted the importance of respecting one another's ideas.
